1. A heart of compassion leads to hands that
1 Peter 4:7-10 —The end of all things is near; therefore, be alert and soberminded for prayer. Above all, maintain constant love for one another, since love covers a multitude of sins. John 13:35 —By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.
